



Cell Phone Rules
2024-2025 School Year
Anderson High School and Turpin High School

Purpose for cell phone rules:

To create a learning environment that minimizes distractions and maximizes student engagement and safety in compliance with new state legislation set by Governor DeWine and HB 250.

High school cell phone expectations during the school day:

1. Cell phones and ALL mobile devices shall be turned off or set to silent mode from 8:00 a.m.-2:40 p.m. **EXCEPT** during class transition and assigned lunch period.
2. Cell Phones and all mobile devices shall be kept in a student's backpack or locker (unless teachers have an assigned cubby/holder per their classroom procedures).
3. Cell phones and all mobile devices are not allowed to be used in instructional spaces: **class time, Study Hall, and Advisory/FLEX.**
4. Cell phones and all mobile devices can be used at the end of the school day at 2:40 p.m.
5. If a student needs to make an emergency call during instructional time, they can come to the office.
6. If other technology is connected to a cell phone (earbuds, smartwatches, etc.) and is being used to access cell phone functions, that device is also not permitted and subject to the following "failure to comply" steps listed below.

High school cell phone expectations during lunch:

1. Students can get their cell phones/mobile devices out during their assigned lunch period.
2. If students need to communicate with their parents/guardians and vice versa, this would be the appropriate time to communicate with them:

ANDERSON LUNCH BELLS:

4th Period: 10:59 - 11:22

6th Period: 11:48 - 12:11

8th Period: 12:37 - 1:00

TURPIN LUNCH BELLS:

A Lunch: 10:56 - 11:19

B Lunch: 11:23 - 11:46

C Lunch: 11:50 - 12:13

3. Students need to place their cell phones/mobile devices in backpack or locker once their lunch period is over until the end of the school day (2:40 p.m.)

Failure to Comply:

- 1st Offense: Verbal Warning and Teacher Public School Works Documentation (with automatic email sent home).
- 2nd Offense: Public School Works Documentation (with automatic email sent home) and Teacher Communication.
- 3rd Offense: Public School Works Referral and Office Consequence
- 4th Offense: Public School Works Referral and Office Assigned Consequence

- 5th Offense: Family Meeting with Administrator
- Any additional offenses will result in a progression of disciplinary consequences as determined by school administration.
- Students refusing to comply with any steps listed above will receive disciplinary action from school administration.
