Semester grades are determined by formula: 45% 1st quarter numerical grade, 45% 2nd quarter, and 10% semester final exam. For courses without a final exam, the two quarter grades are numerically averaged.

Friendly Attendance Reminders

Attendance is an incredibly important piece of our efforts to educate students. Even missing a few days a month can have a lasting impact on learning. Did you know that students who have never been chronically absent are 9 times more likely to graduate from high school on time and 6.7 times more likely to read on grade level by the end of third grade? Here are some important reminders regarding FHSD attendance policies and procedures.

- A parent/guardian phone call received by the attendance office, on each day of the student's absence, for any of the Board-approved reasons, is sufficient to excuse the child's absence up to the tenth absence yearly.
- Subsequently, after the tenth absence, the parent/guardian must provide written documentation from a treating physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant, or relevant third party, stating the day(s) absent and the reason for such absence.
- Student absence events (full day, tardy, early dismissal) in excess of ten, will be recorded as unexcused unless a doctor's note or third-party documentation (Board-approved reasons) is presented to attendance officials for each additional absence. Without a doctor's note or hird-party documentation, truancy charges can be brought and charged to the parent and/or student.

Visiting Campus during School Hours

For safety measures, all parents are required to enter through the main entrance during school hours (8:00am-2:40pm). The athletic entrance will not be available to drop off food for athletic teams, volunteer at the concession stand, or make other deliveries during school hours. Anyone who rings the athletic entrance doorbell will be directed to come to the main entrance.

Ohio State Testing for Fall:

The fall Ohio State Testing window will run from Monday, December 9th - Friday, December 13th. Students who might be missing an Ohio State Test, students who might need to retake the required Algebra I or English Language Arts II, any student taking a CCP course for a tested area, and students currently sitting in government will test during this window.

If your student needs to test, you will be receiving an email from Dr. Warren over the next few weeks with the required test, testing date, and more information to help prepare for the assessment. If you have any questions, feel free to contact her @ ashleywarren@foresthills.edu.
