Semester Exams

Students should be aware that exams are just around the corner. We encourage students to begin reviewing their notes, participating in study groups, and utilizing any additional resources provided by their teachers. Our teaching staff is committed to supporting every student through this process, offering extra help sessions and guidance as needed. Let's work together to ensure that all students feel prepared and confident to succeed in their exams.

First semester exams will be held on the final four days prior to the Winter Break, December 17 through December 20. Please see the exam schedule. Take note that on December 18, 19, and 20, students will have two exams per day and will be dismissed at 11:00am. Our normal afternoon bus routes will run at 11:00am on those days and no lunches will be provided in the cafeteria.

Ohio State Testing for Fall:

The fall Ohio State Testing window will run from Monday, December 9th - Friday, December 13th. Students who might be missing an Ohio State Test, students who might need to retake the required Algebra I or English Language Arts II, any student taking a CCP course for a tested area, and students currently sitting in government will test during this window.
