#### **Cold Weather Recess Guidelines**

Recess is a healthy and important part of the school day for our Wildcats. We want our students to have the opportunity to run and play outside whenever possible, even when it's cold. Therefore, please make sure children are coming to school prepared to spend time outside with coats and hats (label everything). We will adhere to the district guidelines when determining whether or not it's too cold to be outside.

 Outside Recess → If the temperature is above 20 degrees and the wind chill is above 15 degrees.

- A Brief Recess → When the wind chill is between 5 15 degrees, children have a choice to go outside for no more than 10 minutes.
- Inside Recess → When snow covers the blacktop, and/or when the temperature is less than 20 degrees and the wind chill is less than 5 degrees, children will have indoor recess.
