FHSD is aware of an increased number of bees at multiple schools this fall. Please know that we take the safety of students, staff and visitors extremely seriously, and we're working diligently to address this issue. We have had pest control services on site at all 12 district properties to evaluate and treat the problem areas. Our understanding is that two mild winters in a row is contributing to this problem across our region, so it is not something unique to our schools. Our custodial teams are washing all garbage cans, spraying areas with bee spray and adjusting our recycling schedule in response to these challenges.
