### **District Information**

### Second and Fourth Grade CogAT Testing

Ohio's revised standards for gifted education require that all districts offer cognitive testing once during the K-2 grade band and once

during the 3-6 grade band. The Forest Hills School District will be testing in grades 2 and 4 for the 2024-2025 school year. The CogAT Test measures the level and pattern of cognitive development of a student compared to age mates and grade mates. These general reasoning abilities, which start developing at birth and continue through early adulthood, are influenced by experiences gained both in and out of school.

All second and fourth graders in the Forest Hills School District will be taking the CogAT assessment. Fourth grade will take the assessment September 30-October 3, 2024 with Makeups on Oct. 4, 2024. Second grade will take the assessment on February 24-28, 2025. Make ups will take place March 11-12, 2025.

The test is divided into 3 subtests, verbal, non-verbal, and quantitative, which take approximately 45 minutes each. Students will do these subtests over the course of three settings in the classroom. This testing is used to identify students who are cognitively gifted. We use this information as a measure for providing gifted services and support for student learning.

Since this assessment is about how students think, there is nothing you need to do to prepare your child. It is all about how students process information, recognize patterns, and make connections with pictures, numbers, and symbols. The best way to help your child is to make sure they have a good night's sleep and breakfast.
